Candidate has to submit the synopsis in 5 hard copies and soft copy in CD/DVD

### **About the content in Synopsis**

Candidate has to prepare the synopsis in approximately 5000 words in following format.

- **Title of the Topic:** Name of Topic
- **Introduction:** It will have introduction of the research proposal of the candidate related to his/her proposed plan of research in 1200-1500 words
- **Literature Review:** In this section, Candidate has to refer the context/method/idea of 8-10 research papers as reference related to his/her topic in 1500-2000 words
- **Methodology:** In this section, Candidate has to explain the proposed methodology of research and the details of software/ Simulation tool if any, data collection method if any in 1200-1500 words.
- **Expected Outcome (Conclusion of research proposal):** In this section, candidate has to explain the expected outcome of the research work proposed by him/her. It should be in 500-800 words.
- **References:** Minimum 10-12 references of related research papers, websites, text books should be mentioned in Reference

### **About Presentation**

This will be a small verbal presentation of total 50 marks based on the research synopsis submitted by the candidate in presence of external examiner through power point. The presentation should include- **Motivation behind the topic chosen, reference papers taken related to this topic, Methodology to be opted for research and expected outcome of research.**
